The Master's of Science in Child Life and Pediatric Psychosocial Care is the

first program of its kind in Canada. It is a **professional and practice-focused graduate degree** offered through a blended delivery of **online and in-class formats**. The online courses **provide a highly accessible and flexible schedule** while the mandatory in-person residency courses (4 days each on campus) provide learners with the **opportunity to network and engage** with faculty and students.

Graduates will be prepared to incorporate and advocate for pediatric psychosocial needs and patient and family-centred care to address the diverse needs of infants, children, youth and families in pediatric health and community settings.

TWO STREAMS ARE OFFERED



Will provide academic and clinical training (2 internships) to prepare students with knowledge, clinical skills, and professional behaviours to practice as entry-level child life specialists.

Full Time 2 Years

Stream 2 Will provide health professionals with advanced practice skills in pediatric psychosocial care, in a course-based format (no internships) to broaden their careers.

MSc. ADMISSIONS

Applicants are required to meet admission requirements of the School of Graduate Studies:

- Honour's degree or the international equivalent from an accredited university
- B+ average in the final year of undergraduate study

STREAM 1

Stream 1 has earned graduate endorsement through the ACLP. It is offered as a full-time, 24 month long, entry-to-child life practice Master's program. All courses are required and follow sequentially. Graduates of this stream meet child life professional certifi cation eligibility requirements.

STREAM 2

Stream 2 students have both required and elective course options so studies can be tailored to suit continuing education interests.

The anticipated completion is 12 months (full-time) or 24-48 months (part-time). Students will acquire theoretical and applied knowledge to support child and youth coping, and recommend systems to enhance patient and family centred services in their clinical settings.
